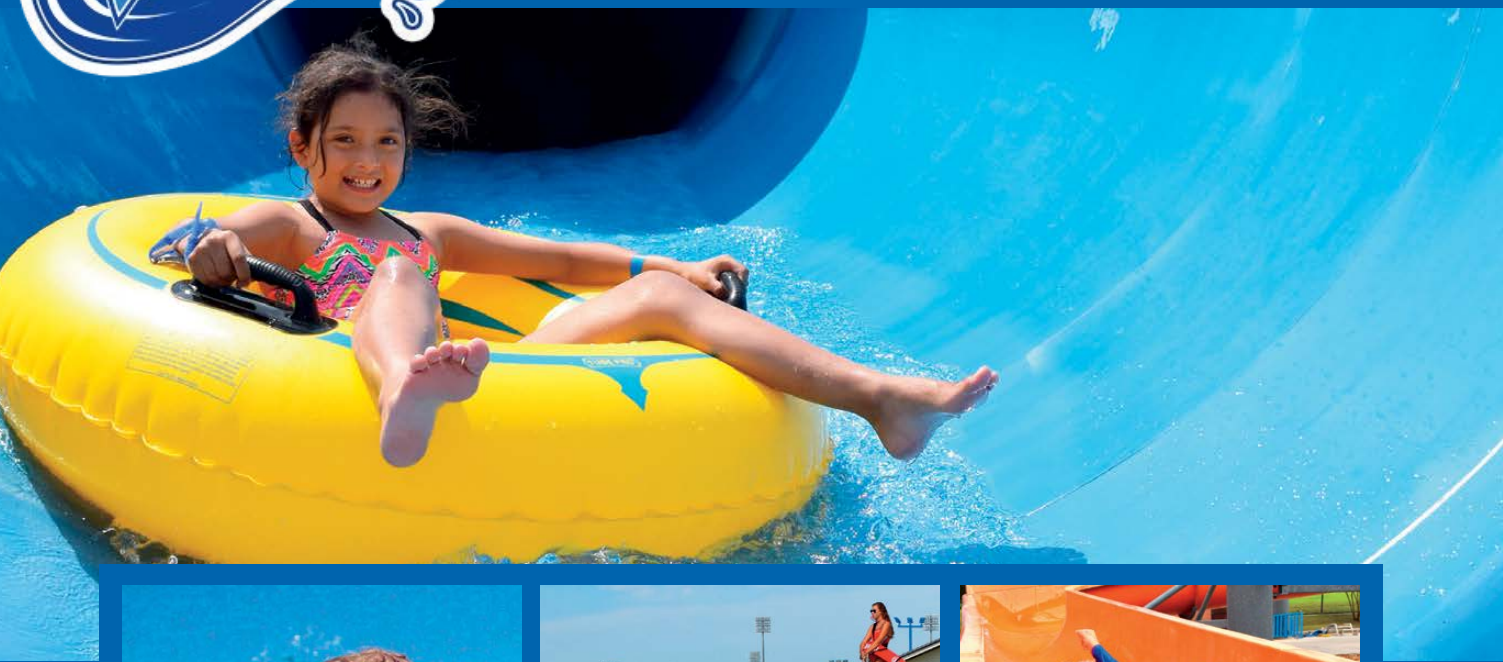

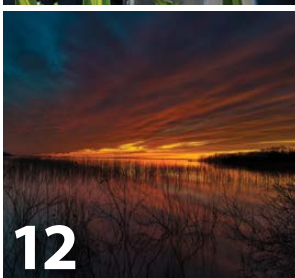

Aaron Lewis will kick off the event on the Miller Lite Main Stage Friday, August 19, and the fun will continue with headlining performances by the Bellamy Brothers, La Zenda Nortena, Jake Hooker & the Outsiders, Dylan Wheeler, Kody West, Casey Donahew, Stoney LaRue, Charley Crockett and Josh Turner.

Every August, NTFR consistently brings exceptional country music to the north Texas region. Nevertheless, with a rapidly growing association built on several generations of memberships and volunteers, NTFR strives to place family fun and tradition at the forefront of everything it does.

Summer Opportunities for Youth in Denton County

It has only been spring for a few weeks, but Denton County 4-H is in full swing planning summer events. Our goal for all of our summer events is to offer the youth in Denton County to experience a little of AgriLife Extension and 4-H. We have various programs for all ages, covering a topics ranging from Food and Nutrition to STEM and more. In this article I will talk about each program Denton County 4-H will be offering, as well as two that our fellow Extension professionals are planning.

Clover Kids Camp

Our Clover Kids Camp is for youth who are not old enough to be official 4-H members yet. It is open to kindergarten through second graders, and will be held on July 12-14 at the North Texas Fairgrounds in Fair Hall. They will be experiencing what 4-H has to offer each morning from 9 am to 12 pm! This camp will focus on Texas 4-H's Top Five Project Areas: Food & Nutrition, Agriculture, Leadership and Citizenship, Natural Resources, and STEM. There is no cost associated with this event and to register please visit denton.agrilife.org/upcoming/.

4-H Summer Expo

Denton County 4-H has so much to offer! To help showcase this we have created an event for the entire family. On Wednesday, July 27th from 3-7 PM, we will have a 4-H Summer Expo held at the North Texas Fairgrounds. We are encouraging our 4-H clubs to set up a booth highlighting one project or event that Denton County 4-H offers. Some of the activities include STEM Robotics, Archery, Food and Nutrition, Horticulture, Small and Large Animal Showcase, Camping Education and more! 4-H & FCH Boot Camp

One of Texas 4-H's largest projects is Food and Nutrition. We want to provide an opportunity this summer for youth who may be new or experienced in this project, to have a chance to learn. This is a two day camp. The first day will cover Food & Nutrition while the second day will focus on Fashion and Interior Design. There is no cost associated with this camp and you do not have to attend both days. It will

be held on Tuesday, August 2nd and Thursday August 4th, from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm. To register you can visit denton.agrilife.org/upcoming/.

I also wanted to mention two other camps this summer. The first is the Farm to Table Camp that Denton Parks and Rec and our colleagues at the AgriLife Extension office are hosting. It will be June 13-17, from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm at Clear Creek Heritage Center. The cost for this camp is \$65. Youth who attend this camp will learn where food comes from and how to prepare it in a healthy way by bringing the farm to their table! To register please visit dentonparks.com.

Lastly, the other camp I wanted to throw out there was the JMG & JMN Camp. JMG & JMN is Junior Master Gardner and Naturalist. This camp will be held June 20-24 for youth in Denton County. Playgrounds, recreation centers, sports leagues, and summer camps are just a few things that come to mind when we think of traditional parks and recreation. Experience something new this summer and join Denton Parks and Recreation for July's Parks and Recreation Month. We challenge you to explore our parks, pools, and playground. Look beyond the facilities for unique and enjoyable opportunities that benefit all ages.



As community needs grow and expand, so do the programs and services offered by city parks and recreation departments. Traditionally the focus has been on health and fitness programs and facilities, but that has surprisingly changed and grown to include experiences that are actively social and family-centric, as well as intergenerational.

With the support through participation, non-traditional opportunities continue to grow and serve as a means for youth to engage both physically and emotionally and for adults to socialize with youth and actively participate.

Here's a sample of events to expect this summer from Denton Parks and Recreation!

Celebrate Independence Day Together

In a 2021 NRPA survey conducted by

Wakefield Research, 93% percent of U.S. adults say a summer activity from parks and recreation brings back happy memories. Why not make new memories and participate in the 24th Annual Liberty 5K Run or 1-Mile Walk. Make a day of it, walk or run in the morning, stay for the parade, and then visit Quakertown Park for the July Jubilee. Consider participating in the Hot Dog Eating Contest or enjoy live music, food trucks, inflatables, carnival games, and lots of fun.

Go With the Flow

Another option is to take a kayaking class. This introduction to paddling class covers basic boat orientation, safety skills, and stroke technique. For ages eight and older, it's an excellent opportunity all ages to engage and discover healthy fun in an intergenerational class.

Big Wave Days

If you haven't discovered the wave pool at Water Works Park, then this summer is the perfect time! It's just the right mix of fun and relaxation as the waves differ in size and flow between cycles. The park is also home to four giant waterslides, two toddler slides, a children's play pool, a lazy river, sand volleyball, cabanas, party pavilions, and more!

Get Down and Dirty

Community gardens cultivate lifelong lessons about the origins of what we

consume and foster the desire for healthy, fresh eating. For some families, a community garden with rentable plots is the only chance they have for growing their own fruits and vegetables. The community garden at Bowling Green Park in Denton is a great example of how parks and recreation has grown outside of the box and encourages families to cultivate new outdoor experiences.

Blow off some STEAM

That's right, STEAM, not STEM, which stands for "Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math." STEAM adds ART by acknowledging that STEM naturally involves the need to be creative in some form or fashion. Most communities, regardless of where you live, offer summer learning camps either through parks and recreation, the local school district, or in some cases, through a partnership. Youth Tech Inc., a non-profit computer camp, teaches programs such as Gaming and Coding, Animation, and Video Game Design at MLK Jr. Recreation Center.

LARGE ENTHUSIASTIC CROWD CELEBRATES SHARON COX AT BUILDING DEDICATION

In a beautiful outdoor setting underneath a sun-drenched sky, 250 guests celebrated the building dedication ceremony for the Sharon Cox Communications Center, a center named for a former journalist and state education advocate. Those on hand included district dignitaries, former employees and colleagues, and professional peers of the building's namesake.

Denton ISD Board of Trustees President Doug Chadwick started the event off with a warm welcome message and thanked the attendees for being on hand to honor Mrs. Cox. He was followed in remarks by Dr. Jamie Wilson, superintendent of schools, who told a few anecdotes from his time working alongside Mrs. Cox as his director of communications.

Todd Camp, marketing and communications manager at American Airlines Credit Union, shared his admiration and being mentored by Mrs. Cox as a young journalist upon graduation from TCU. WFAA Daybreak Anchor Marc Istook credited Mrs. Cox for giving him career focus and direction after she introduced him to the newspaper series "Class Acts" in which she served as an editor while at the Fort Worth Star-Telegram in the early nineties.

Retired superintendent of schools, Dr. Ray Braswell, then shared a very influential tenure with Mrs. Cox. Dr. Braswell hired Mrs. Cox for the position in 1999. During her time in the district, Mrs. Cox was a one-person operation that was responsible for not only communicating the programs and successes of the district to families but also making sure the needs of those same families she supported were being met.

Dr. Braswell spoke of the various programs created by Mrs. Cox, not just for parents, but she also brought unique measures to get various stakeholders (grandparents, business leaders, district employees, etc.) involved in supporting public education and helping families whenever they needed assistance. Many of these programs have been adopted by school districts across the state and still flourish today.

He also credited Mrs. Cox for being instrumental in helping the district keep up with growth, helping pass five bond elections, and guiding the Board of Trustees to a pair of Top 5 Texas Honor Board recognitions. Many colleagues, several of whom were on hand, continue to seek her advice and counsel on political campaigns, public engagement, and program implementation today.

Perhaps the proudest moment from his time with Mrs. Cox was her creation of the Grandparents in Public Schools (GIPS) Task Force, which promoted grandparent volunteers to mentor students at Denton ISD schools. The program has nearly doubled in members since its inception more than twenty years ago. Denton ISD's GIPS program is just one of the many initiatives created by Mrs. Cox to be recognized by both local and national public education organizations and has been copied by many other districts in the state of Texas.

Dr. Braswell became emotional when speaking about Mrs. Cox's ability to manage all of the demands of her job and balance her family responsibilities while raising three children.

Jackie Jackson, executive director of Denton Public School Foundation (DPSF),



talked about her time working first as Mrs. Cox's secretary for a brief stint, followed by their time working together in the community on behalf of the district.

Former Denton ISD communications director, Mario Zavala, Jr., relayed his affection for Mrs. Cox as a mentor and colleague when hired by the district and then was tabbed as her replacement when she retired in 2015.

The honoree then took the stage and thanked those in attendance as well as those who took the time to speak on her behalf. She also announced a ten-thousand-dollar scholarship from her family in honor of her children which will be given to multiple Denton ISD students for years to come.

"I've always been proud to be a part of Denton ISD – as a parent and as an educator – because the district is extremely supportive of students and all of their educational endeavors. Communications and community relations are vital to the success of each student as we continue to bridge the communications gap from the child's home to the classroom and school," said Sharon Cox. "From grandparents in our mentoring programs to volunteers donating thousands of hours to help our students succeed, as well as hundreds of advocates helping to support and pass every bond election in the past two decades. The district's success is exemplified through the hard work of the district's past and current staff, administrators, and board members."

Current Denton ISD Chief Communications Officer, Julie Zwahr, closed the ceremony by mentioning the time she's known Mrs. Cox and her many fond memories of their interactions together, which date to when Mrs. Zwahr was a high school student and Mrs. Cox was the editor for her town's local newspaper, The Arlington Citizen's Journal.

Mrs. Cox has more than 40 years of service in news reporting/editing, school communications, and school media relations in North Texas. Her career culminated with a 15-year stint as Director of Communications and Community Relations in Denton ISD. She served as state president of both the Texas School Public Relations Association (TSPRA) and the Texas Association of Partners in Education (TAPE).

In 2014, TSPRA awarded Mrs. Cox with the organization's "Professional Achievement Award," an honor bestowed upon exceptional professionals for their cumulative body of work.

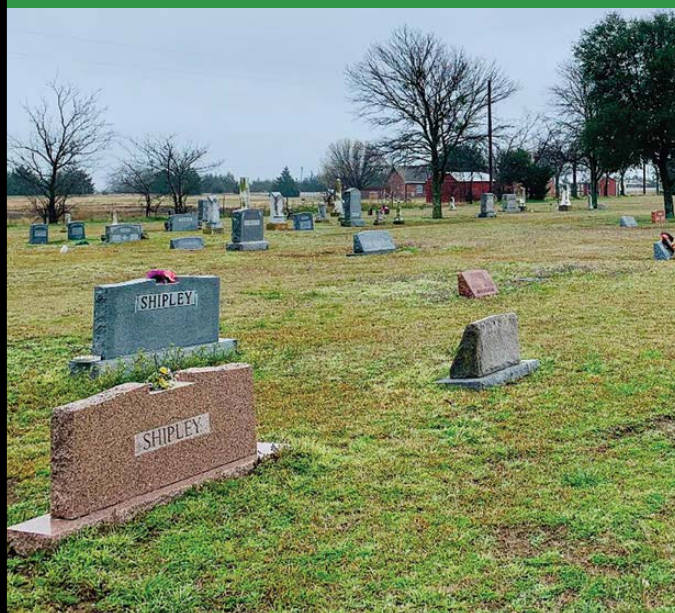

READY TO BE ON LAKE TIME?

As the brutal Texas summer gets warmer and warmer, we all have one thought on our minds: how do we cool off for the summer?

For those who are ready to plan your awesome day (or even weekend!) out at Lake Ray Roberts State Park (100 PW 4137), we've got you covered with all you need to know to be Lovin' the Lake!

BEFORE YOU GO

It's not truly fun in the sun, if you aren't grilling while you're doing it. So before you head out on the lake, don't forget your grilling supplies! Pick up a gas or charcoal grill at Ace Hardware (316 US 377), then load up on amazing supplies, seasonings and rubs at Pilot Point Feed Store (1156 US 377)! And, of course, all of the hot dogs and hamburgers you'll need to throw on the grill can be found at Brookshire Brothers (750 US 377).

Just a friendly reminder that alcohol consumption is not allowed in the open in the state park. However, if you wish to imbibe in a beverage, you are allowed to do so within your RV. Brookshires, as well as 377 Liquor (1137 US 377) and Liberty Liquor (420 US 377) are great places to pick up beverages to enjoy while on your excursions.

AT THE LAKE

How do you plan to spend your time at the lake?

If you're ready to get away from it all with your RV or a tent, you can easily book your campsite in advance through the Texas Parks & Wildlife website. This is highly recommended so that you ensure your space!

If you're just there for an afternoon of water fun, check out the swimming beach, or request a Junior Ranger Explorer Pack for the kiddos. The helpful park rangers at the entrance can guide you to the best spots for various outdoor activities, including biking, hiking, and kayaking.

Did you come without equipment, but want to check out the full scope of the lake? Lone Star Lodge Resort & Marina (2200 FM 1192) has rentals, from pontoon boats to kayaks and jet skis! Book your rentals online at Lonestar-lodge.com.

Lake Ray Roberts is open daily. Entry is \$7 for adults 13 and older, and children 12 and younger receive free admission. For those intrepid travelers, the Texas State Parks Pass, enabling you to visit any Texas State Park at your leisure, is \$70 per year.

COME BACK TO TOWN

If you're needing a break from the lake, come right on back in town! Pilot Point has delicious places to eat, from yummy burgers to delicious Italian food and Tex Mex. Head to the historic Square and do some shopping, or check out the recent Historic Walking Tour of downtown on visitpilotpoint.org. Make it a Pilot Point weekend to remember!
