DENTON COUNTY, TX- Eleven Denton ISD National Merit Scholarship students have been chosen out of 1.6 million total entrants to be semi-finalists or

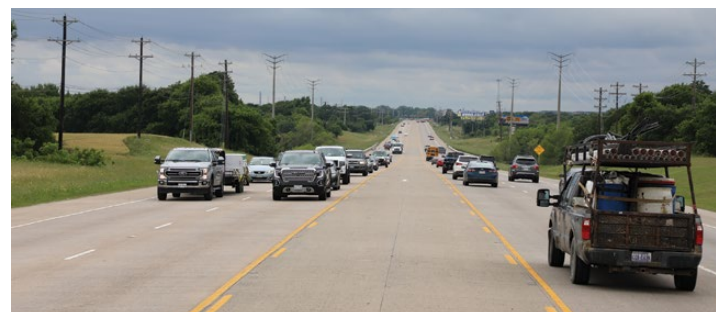

The four join a pool of just 16,000 National Merit Semifinalists in the entire country. High school students are selected into the program based on their top scores on the 2023 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT).

Denton County Transportation Bond (Proposition A)

on Nov. 8 ballot



DENTON COUNTY, TX- The Transportation Road Improvement Program – 2022 (TRIP-22) is listed as Proposition A on the Nov. 8 Election Day Ballot. The program, if approved by voters, will fund more than 119 projects in more than 32 municipalities and unincorporated areas. The projects include state highways, local arterials within cities, safety improvements, and county roads and bridges.

Denton County is routinely

in the top 10 fastest growing counties in the nation by percentage.

Denton County's population grew approximately 43.5% from the 662,614 people who lived in the county in 2010 to an estimated 950,660 in 2022, according to the U.S. Census and the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG). For comparison, the population in the U.S. grew 7.4% and the population in Texas grew 15.9% during

Denton ISD Begins Rezoning Discussions for Cheek Middle School

DENTON COUNTY, TX- In the coming weeks, Denton ISD leadership will begin making plans to open Cheek Middle School in the fall of 2023. Part of those plans involves adjustments that will have to be made to attendance zone boundaries to ensure that we keep the number of students at a level that provides them with the most significant opportunity to learn and grow. These boundary zone changes will take effect at the start of the 2023-2024 school year.

Boundary changes

will impact some current fifth, sixth, and seventh graders in the Braswell High School zone. Current seventh graders who might otherwise be affected may choose to remain at Navo Middle School or Rodriguez Middle School for their eighth-grade year. Siblings of current seventh graders will also be able to stay at their current middle school campus, should families choose, so long as they are already enrolled or will be enrolled before the start of the 2023-2024 school year.

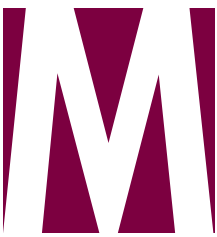

DFH was founded in 2004 and operates a 17-acre main campus in Aubrey, Texas along with additional locations throughout the Denton, Texas and Marion, Kansas areas. Denton Freedom House aims to mend every broken life. DFH accomplishes its vision through providing services, free of charge, to individuals and families in need.

DFH has residential faith-based programs for men and women, which are a minimum commitment of six months. DFH receives men and women off the streets, out of prison, or struggling with addiction and offers them freedom through the gospel of Jesus Christ in a loving and structured home. In the program, residents attend Biblical classes, life skills classes,

serve the community, and reconcile relationships with God and their families. After graduation, DFH offers continuing education classes, Bible studies, continued residential services, and helps graduates obtain personal identification cards, driver's licenses, and employment. DFH assists graduates in reintegrating back into their families, churches, businesses, and communities.

Zera Coffee & Events is a coffee shop with a cause! Residents learn barista skills and serve the community in a healthy and healing way that brings people hope. Zera Events offers a variety of event spaces to accommodate small or large group sizes for any occasion, full catering services, and media or music equipment options. Visit Zera for a cup of coffee and all proceeds benefit DFH.

Freedom Food Pantry is located in Denton and is open Monday-Friday. FFP is a client choice pantry and clients may visit as often as they have need. FFP serves a large homeless population with daily need of food and assistance.

Denton Freedom House has volunteer opportunities for individuals and groups. DFH accepts monetary donations and also needs male and female personal hygiene items, feminine products, cleaning products, toilet paper, binders, highlighters, pens, Bibles, and journals on an ongoing basis. Top Five Tips to Taking Better Pics of Your Kids with Any Camera

Summer has come and gone. We have spent time with our kids and now they are back in school. As things go back to a routine and we have a little time to think and reflect we realize how important it is to catch those little moments that freeze time and help us remember the days that go by, oh! so quickly. We see those perfect Instagram shots and think, "Wow! They must have a really good camera!"

I am here to let you in on a little secret, they have the same phone camera as you. They just know a few things you don't. That's why I am sharing my top



Getting down to their level let's you see more emotion. It also give them that moment of surprise where you can capture their eyes.

5 tips you will want to follow when you are taking pics of your kiddos indoors and out.

Get down on their level – This REALLY makes a difference. If this is all you did different your photos would significantly better. You want the viewer to see them eye to eye instead of look-



By simply opening up the blackout curtain and leaving the white one down to diffuse the light her eyes brightened and her skin tone is more even.

ing down at them when viewing the picture. You can do this by taking a knee or if you have a viewfinder that pops out you can angle it up while you take the picture at your hip.

Find the light – Light is one of the most essential parts of taking a good photo. Look to see where the light is coming from and where it is falling. If you are indoors, open the curtain or let your kiddos play near the area where the light is coming

in. If you are outside locate the light position yourself accordingly. People tend to want to stay in the sunlight when taking a photo, but the best thing to do is find the shade. Especially during midday. The best time to photograph your child is 1-2 hours after sunrise or 2-3 hours before sunset. This is also a plus because that is the time kiddos are in the best mood, at least that's the case at my house.

Find a new perspective – Don't be afraid to look silly taking a photo. Go on the floor and shoot up, see what your one year old sees. Go under the playground stairs and have your child look down. Shoot through leaves or a bush. Take a few steps back and



zoom out to get the whole scene then zoom in on one aspect of the scene to show detail. Get creative!

Change the Line – When taking a photo of 3 or more people you want to create triangles and levels. Get away from the shoulder to shoulder pose and ask one to kneel or sit or stand up on the curb. There are lots of ways to create levels. You just have to speak up and not be afraid to give a little direction.

Lastly ... Clean your lens – I know it sounds like a no brainer, but sometimes the only reason you may be getting blurry pictures is because there is a small smudge on your camera lens. I keep a small eyeglass cleaner cloth in my purse and use that to clean it before I start taking pictures. Just make sure you don't use any scratchy fabric to clean it, you don't want to scratch your lens.

that period. Denton County grows by an average of 82 people a day.

"As more and more people choose to take advantage of all that Denton County has to offer, diligence is required to ensure that the transportation infrastructure will be in place to serve both existing and future residents," said Denton County Judge Andy Eads. "We have seen our roads get more congested, leading to longer commutes and delays of our first responders heading to emergencies."

To date, Denton County Commissioners, working with transportation partners, have utilized the voter-approved proceeds of \$187 million from the 2004 road bond program and \$310 million from the 2008 road bond program to fund and construct more than \$8.4 billion in roadway projects throughout the county.

"Our partnership with the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) and the North Central Texas Council of Governments has resulted in many transportation successes including the widening of IH 35E from the Denton/

Dallas County line to US 380 to add additional capacity throughout the corridor, widening FM 1171 from IH 35E to IH 35W to 6 lanes, extending FM 2499 from the Dallas/Fort Worth Airport to IH 35E in Denton, and the widening of FM 544, FM 423, FM 2181, FM 407 and many more," Judge Eads said.

Denton County was able to complete transportation projects while managing its road bond debt to maintain an AAA bond rating. Denton County is one of only seven counties out of the 254 counties in Texas to attain this rating. During that same period, the county's tax rate has dropped from \$0.28.49 per \$100 property valuation in 2012 to \$0.21.75 per \$100 property valuation in 2022.

Lowering the property tax rate to the lowest level in over three decades has resulted in Denton County having the lowest countywide tax rate of the 15 most populated counties in Texas.

Additional improvements are needed to IH 35E, IH 35 North of Denton and IH 35W as the county's population in-

creases, officials said.

"Farm to Market roads in previously rural areas are struggling under the congestion occurring in the northern and eastern portions of our county. Roadways such as US 377 through Pilot Point, FM 1385, FM 2931 and Loop 288 West need widening to meet the residents' needs," Judge Eads said.

"Our communities are linked by many arterial roadways such as these that have been operating at or above capacity rates for years, as well as small asphalt and substandard roads under stress from increased heavy truck and local traffic," Judge Eads said. "Many new schools have been built and filled within Denton County, putting more strain on our overburdened system."

Working closely with elected officials and staff from cities within Denton County, the Denton County

Commissioners Court was able identify critical local roadway needs.

TRIP-22 was planned and developed to provide Denton County with the tools needed to accommodate the county's future growth. While providing the required local participation funds to advance the many TxDOT on-system projects critical to Denton County citizens, TRIP-22 is focused on local roads both within and between the communities across Denton County.

Early voting begins October 24th and ends November 4th, 2022. Election Day is Tuesday November 8th, 2022.

liveries of food. We're looking for people with a willingness to learn and a passion for serving their neighbors with love.

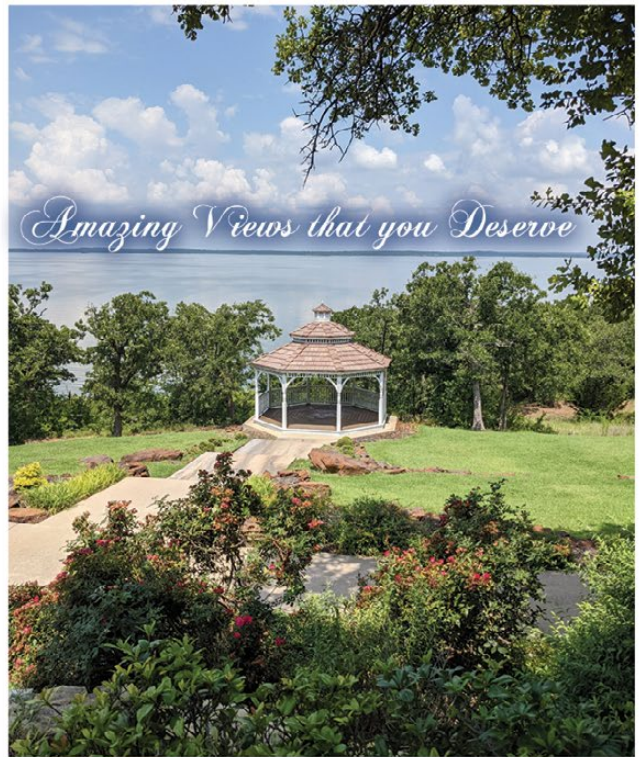

Why Home Rule? *And Who is in Control*



AUBREY, TX-The City of Aubrey is currently a General Law City governed by the laws of the State of Texas. Because the City has grown to over 5,000 in population, the Texas Constitution allows the City to establish its own rules for municipal government by adopting a Home Rule Charter. The City would still be subject to statutory and Constitutional constraints, but the powers available to the City through the

Charter would be greatly expanded up to the limits set in the Charter, not by State law.

As communities grow the Home Rule Charter provides the flexibility to address the complexity of local government. The vast majority of Texas cities that have reached the 5,000 population threshold have elected to pursue their own Home Rule Charter rather than to remain a General Law City.

Once a Charter is adopted, the citi-

zens retain control over the Charter through the amendment process. This ensures the citizens are always in a position to determine the form, power, and authority of their City government.
