



Located in downtown Denton, the Denton County Courthouse-on-the-Square Museum offers a glimpse into the history and culture of the area through rotating and permanent exhibits. Housed inside the iconic 1896 Courthouse designed by architect W.C. Dodson, the museum's permanent exhibits include an evolution of firearms, a 1913 farm wagon that belonged to the family of Denton County Judge Andy Eads, and a vintage grocery store for interactive play. On the second floor, visitors can take in the historic Commissioners Courtroom and admire the restored features of the pressed tin ceiling and the woodwork. On the courthouse lawn, visitors may be surprised to find the grave of the county's namesake, John B. Denton.

Opening on September 8, 2023, Team Spirit is an exhibit highlighting public high schools in Denton County. The exhibit features photographs and items throughout the decades that represent the high school experience in Denton County from academics to sports and everything in between. For Denton County alumni, consider it a homecoming celebration!

After visiting the Courthouse-on-the-Square Museum, take a stroll over to the Denton County Historical Park. Just a few blocks from the downtown square, the Historical Park is home to the Bayless-Selby House

Museum, the Taylor Log Cabin, and the Denton County African American Museum, Each of these museums provide a look into early periods of Denton County's history.

The Denton County Historical Park is located at 317 West Mulberry Street, at the corner of Carroll Boulevard and Mulberry Street.

RIDE AGAIN IN PILOT POINT

very year, infamous outlaws Bonnie Parker and Clyde Barrow ride again in North Texas.

While the actual Bonnie & Clyde died in a hail of gunfire in rural Louisiana in the 1930s, Pilot Point comes together every year to commemorate the filming of the classic film starring Faye Dunaway and Warren Beatty. "Bonnie & Clyde", shot in 1966 in various locations around north Texas, filmed its famous bank robbery scene in the Farmers and Merchants Bank on the corner of Washington and Main.

This year's Bonnie & Clyde Days Festival, which recognizes the Academy Award-winning film shot right in the Historic Pilot Point Square, will be on October 14. From 10 a.m. to 8 p.m., this festival boasts activities for families, the Soap Box Challenge, vendor booths, live music and other performances, plus the famed reenactments.

THE FILMING

Dunaway and Beatty were the leads in a star-studded cast that descended upon north Texas in the fall of 1966 for the filming of the movie, which also included appearances by Gene Hackman, Estelle Parsons (who won an Oscar for her portrayal of Blanche Barrow) and Gene Wilder. Frequently, director Arthur Penn would cast locals to play the extras. That's how Purple Door Salon owner Bobbie Jezek found herself in the film as one of the children. Other local extras, according to news reports, included relatives of Mayor George Hilz (his 11-yearold daughter Karen Hilz and nephew 14-year-old Michael Hilz), and Mrs. Harold Smith (wife of then Chamber of Commerce President).

"Bonnie & Clyde", while receiving mixed reviews, was one of the top 5 grossing films of 1967, earning \$70 million worldwide at the box office.

LOCAL CONNECTIONS


An oft-repeated legend is that Bonnie & Clyde were frequently spotted in the Pilot Point area, but not to rob any banks. Clyde Barrow had relatives in the area, who would offer safe haven to the Barrow Gang between their robberies.

Newspaper reports show that Clyde Barrow was briefly incarcerated in the Denton jail in 1930 in connection with the burglary of the Motor Mark Garage.

2023 FESTIVAL

This year's Bonnie & Clyde Days will bring back the festival everyone knows and loves, while also taking it to the next level.


Pilot Point OSCUTA

The Historic Skinner Cemetery from 1858


To visit Turn off US 377 heading south on Debbie Lane for about one third of a mile. You will find the cemetery is on the north side of the road canopied by giant oak trees.



Franklin College Bell

The original bell from Pilot Point Seminary School, which opened in 1872 as a primary and secondary school. The school started offering bachelor degrees in 1884 and officially changed its name to Franklin College in 1892. This was the earliest college in Denton County. The bell can be viewed at the Pilot Point Museum on the Historic Square.

A Hall of Fame Stallion and a Ten Million Dollar Sire, Colonels Smoking Gun (Gunner), and legendary Hall of Fame Six Million Dollar Sire, Hollywood Dun It. Their resting site is visible from the highway.
