providing laptops for all students in kindergarten through 12th grade to ensure district-wide access to the digital tools and resources necessary to participate in classes whether in-person or remotely.

**DENTON ISD, TX-**Denton ISD covers more than 180 square miles compelling its students to spend countless hours on school buses daily. In 2021, Denton ISD implemented a district-wide initiative to address the "digital divide" concern among school-aged students. Since that time, the district has committed to becoming one-to-one by pro-

viding laptops for all students in kindergarten through 12th grade to ensure district-wide access to the digital tools and resources necessary to participate in classes whether in-person or remotely.

This fall, the district has taken that notion a step further. Recently, Denton ISD partnered with the broadband internet connectivity company Cradlepoint, based in Boise, Idaho, to provide free Wi-Fi on all 206 school buses in its fleet.


**COLLIN COUNTY, TX** On August 5, 2022, Collin County Sheriff's Office Deputies responded to a drug overdose at a residence on FM 546 in Princeton, Texas. Upon arrival, Deputies located a 29-year-old male deceased in his bedroom, collected evidence, and interviewed family members and witnesses. Among the items collected was a counterfeit Percocet pill that was later lab tested and determined to contain Fentanyl. Investigators assigned to the

Collin County Sheriff's Office Gang and Habitual Offender Strike Team (GHOST) began an investigation to identify the dealer responsible for selling the Fentanyl-laced drugs that killed this victim. After a thorough investigation, GHOST Investigators identified the suspect and on September 12, 2022 Collin County Judge Lindsey Wynne, 468th District Court, signed an Arrest Warrant charging Gabriel Aldo Fossatti, a resident of Princeton, Texas with Manufacture or Delivery of a Controlled Substance Causing Death or Serious Bodily Injury, a 2nd Degree Felony. On this same day, Judge Wynne also signed a search warrant for Fossatti's residence.

Early Wednesday morning, GHOST Investigators arrested

### US 380 Improvements Recap

**DENTON COUNTY, TX-** While it is obvious that the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) has construction on US 380 in Denton County from US 377 to Collin County Line, underway, lets recap the improvement project. The improvements will increase capacity and reduce congestion, thus improving overall mobility. It will also upgrade the roadway to current

safety design standards and improve pedestrian safety and access to businesses and schools within the 380 Corridor. The total length of Highway 380 that is currently under construction is 10.5 miles. Highway 380's improvement project will widen it from four to six lanes, add a curbed median, sidewalks and add separations at major intersections including: FM 720/Oak Grove Lane,

Road/Union Park Boulevard, FM 423/Gee Road, Teel Parkway/Championship Drive and Legacy Drive. Improvements are expected to be complete in spring 2025.

Seek alternative routes when possible and watch the message boards for upcoming construction activities. TxDOT is urging motorists to use caution in the work zone. Remember, traffic backups are expected to occur.



## It's Time for Fall Gardening

Michele Scaife, Extension Agent – Better Living for Texans



### DENTON COUNTY, TX

Did you know in most Texas areas the climate is suitable for a fall vegetable garden? Many gardeners will plant vegetables in the spring and early summer and not realize they can also grow vegetables in the fall. For help locating, prepping, and establishing a garden site, which can be used for both fall and spring planting, check out the planning guide on AgriLife Extension's Easy Gardening series. (<https://aggie-horticulture.tamu.edu/vegetable/easy-gardening-series/>)

Fall fruits and vegetables are categorized as long- or short-term plants. Some plants may not grow well after the first frost (temperature is below 32°F) and are called frost-susceptible. Other plants may thrive during the cooler season making them frost-tolerant. Group long- or short-term plants together according to their frost tolerance.

Plant short-term, frost-susceptible plants together—they will not survive a frost. Examples include beans, cantaloupe, corn, cucumbers, eggplant, okra, pea,

peppers, Irish potatoes, sweet potatoes, squash, tomatoes, and watermelon.

Plant long-term, frost-tolerant plants together. Examples include beets, broccoli, Brussels sprouts, cabbage, carrot, cauliflower, chard, collard, garlic, kale, lettuce, mustard, onion, parsley, spinach, and turnip.

There are many varieties of fruits and vegetables; however, only three or four varieties may grow well in your county or region. Use Aggie Horticulture's Vegetable Variety Selector to help identify what grows best in your area. ([https://aggie-horticulture.tamu.edu/publications/veg\\_variety/](https://aggie-horticulture.tamu.edu/publications/veg_variety/))

You can grow fruits and vegetables from seed or transplants. Transplants will shorten the growing time in your garden and are recommended in the fall when growing tomatoes, peppers, and eggplants or cold-friendly broccoli, cauliflower, and cabbage. Transplants can also be purchased from your local nursery or retail store.

Don't forget to enjoy your garden! Visit your garden regularly to see growth and changes, and to harvest produce when ready. For more information reach out to your AgriLife Extension County Extension Agent!

Fossatti at his residence and executed the search warrant, which resulted in the seizure of Psilocybin (mushrooms), marijuana, a loaded Glock pistol, and numerous pills, including Xanax and Percocet. The Percocet pills seized were similar to those recovered at the scene of the overdose death of the 29-year-old male in Princeton on August 5. Fossatti was transported to the Collin County Detention Facility.

This investigation is ongoing. Collin County Sheriff Jim Skinner said, Here in Collin County we have seen a 571% increase in the number of Fentanyl-related drug overdose deaths in the past 36 months. Make no mistake, these are fatal Fentanyl poisonings, an act on the part of the Mexican drug cartels who use Fentanyl and its addictive qualities to intentionally increase addiction among Americans. With

catastrophic results, the lack of any meaningful border policy by the current administration has made it too easy for the Cartels to smuggle Fentanyl into the US. Consequently, we are witnessing an historic explosion of fatal Fentanyl poisonings in every town, village and city across this Nation. In Collin County we will continue to investigate every one of these Fentanyl poisonings to identify the dealers responsible for causing these deaths."

classroom walls. Whether traveling home on buses after school or to nearby communities on the night of a ball game or a UIL-sanctioned fine arts contest, students will now be able to complete any outstanding assignments or work on a homework assignment while riding the bus.

"When we travel to away football games, our band members can spend an average of two and a half hours riding on our school buses," said Brian Wilson, Denton High director of bands. "We have band contests in Princeton which is located along the far eastern edge of Collin County and those bus rides can last as long as three hours total time. Travel time to UIL area round band competitions similarly take three hours roundtrip as well. The amount of time our band, cheer, and student-athletes

can spend on a school bus adds up quickly each week."





Band students at Braswell High currently travel along FM 380, a road that is heavily under construction for the next few years. When the Bengal Band makes trips to Saginaw or Plano East for band competitions, those are typically multi-hour bus rides. Round trips bus rides to the UIL area round competition are easily three hours or more.

"We see this as another resource for our students to be able to utilize their district-issued Chromebooks or other devices to complete coursework while riding home on our school buses," said Dr. Sheryl Alden, executive director of transportation. "Since we do cover such a large amount of real estate in our district, we know there are students of ours who do not have connectivity at

home or ones who spend a significant of hours on a school bus to get home and this is just another resource to help those students on their educational journey."

Cradlepoint's NetCloud Service provides Denton ISD with the capabilities needed to manage its in-vehicle work. Through purpose-built ruggedized routers, NetCloud offers enterprise-class reliability, manageability, and security and allows cohesive management using the LTE and 5G edge.

Funding for Wi-Fi hotspots and broadband services for school buses was obtained using Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) funds. Wi-Fi installations on the district's full fleet of school buses began this spring and the work was completed dur-

## LaGrone Academy Health Science Students Provide Free Health Screenings to Pre-K Students

**DENTON COUNTY, TX-** Seniors Emilie Terrell, Diana Calijau Quintero and Grace Read are enrolled in the LaGrone Academy Health Science program. Each of the three has a goal of becoming a Certified Clinical Medical Assistant (CCMA) upon graduation in the spring.

Recently, the trio visited the Ann Windle School for Young Children to provide free health screenings to the students in the Head Start program. Despite being seniors with an eye on graduation, their visit to Ann Windle brought back a flood of childhood memories.

"Ahh, look at them on the playground, they look so cute," said Emilie, laughing. "Seeing them playing and just having fun makes me wish I was still in Pre-K sometimes."

The medical assistant students were performing body mass index (BMI) screenings for the students

enrolled in Head Start. The program follows federal guidelines to provide parents with screenings to promote health. The state of Texas mandates that all students attending the Head Start programs must have BMI health screenings upon their enrollment.

"Having the students in the LaGrone nursing program provide these screenings is a nice benefit to many of our families," said Megan Wilson, school nurse at Windle. "The partnership we have with the LaGrone Health Science Department provides a great experience for our students in the Medical Assistant program. These BMI screenings that you see today consist of height and weight measurements."

Becoming a CCMA is one of the many certification programs offered at the LaGrone Academy. Formerly referred to as the ATC, LaGrone Academy is Denton ISD's high school of choice and was established to sharpen the district's focus on college and career readiness.

The academy, housed at the LaGrone Advanced Technology Complex, serves juniors and seniors who desire flexible scheduling and the opportunity to finish CTE certifications without the burden of traveling to one of the district's four comprehensive high schools for other courses.

## Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service Celebrates Health Literacy Month in October

**DENTON COUNTY, TX-** Health Literacy is having the ability to find, understand, and use basic health information to make good decisions about your health and issues that you might be facing.

"We know that making good decisions about our health requires accurate and correct information. But for some, that can be hard to find and use without increasing their level of health literacy," said Erica Reyes, Program Specialist with Texas A&M AgriLife Extension. "For example, it could be challenging to find a healthcare provider, have a meaningful discussion about your care, and follow a self-care plan without having a good understanding of basic health, or a good level of health literacy," Reyes adds.

There is a lot of misinformation about health that gets shared on websites and social media. When looking for accurate health information, a good place to start are websites that end in ".edu" or ".gov". These endings mean that the website belongs to a university or a government health agency. In addition, groups such as the American Heart Association, American Cancer Society, and Center for Disease Control are good places to find health information that is accurate and easy to understand.

The barrier is not always a lack of education. It may be that the patient has difficulty hearing or remembering parts of a conversation with their

healthcare provider. Taking someone along to appointments to take notes or ask questions may be helpful.

Texas A&M AgriLife Extension in Denton County offers health talk express and a health literacy series to provide support and empower participants with science-based health information to increase their level of health literacy.

It is advised that health care providers and health educators assist by identifying each person's level of health literacy and remember to not use medical terms that are difficult to understand. It is important to use language tailored to each individual, and supplement education with take-home materials that are accessible to everyone in the community.
