Texas Master Naturalist-Elm Fork Chapter

Denton ISD Days at Clear Creek become Virtual Field Trips

DENTON ISD, TX- When the traditional field trips of fourth graders from Denton ISD schools to Clear Creek Natural Heritage Center were shut down by the pandemic last fall, it prompted thinking outside the box. A team of ten Texas Master Naturalist-Elm Fork Chapter volunteers led by Project Manager Sharon Betty, a long-time DISD teacher and administrator, met the challenge by bringing nature to the students through live virtual presentations.

Coordinated for the schools by Tosha Hoefert, Elementary Science Coordinator for Denton ISD, the virtual presentations featured Master Naturalists on topics such as turtles, hiking, erosion and deposition, bees, and Critters of Clear Creek. Teachers registered and were given their Zoom links, and they provided the links to their connected learners at home. A typical presentation had four teachers with 20 students in classrooms and 60 learning from home. Students were able to ask questions and make comments in real time by using the chat feature in Zoom. Moderators for each call filtered those questions for the presenters.

In a typical year, 2000 students in 100 fourth grade classrooms from 23 DISD elementary schools visit Clear Creek Natural Heritage Center in person and are led in activities by Master Naturalist volunteers on site. Everyone hopes that the

in-person program will continue when pandemic restrictions are no longer in place. With restrictions still in place for the spring, however, plans are being made to provide the live virtual presentations as a substitute for the traditional field trips by DISD second graders beginning in April.

The mission of the Texas Master Naturalist program is to develop a corps of well-informed volunteers to provide education, outreach, and service dedicated to the beneficial management of natural resources and natural areas within their communities for the State of Texas.

Texas Master Naturalist-Elm Fork Chapter is one of nearly 50 chapters across the state. Formed in 1999, the chapter has grown to 200 active members. Information about monthly meetings and community service projects is posted on the Chapter's webpage at www.txmnn.org/elmfork.

Elm Fork Chapter, serving Denton, Wise, and Cooke counties, has opened registration for the 2021 fall training class. Individuals can learn more about the organization and download the training application by visiting the Elm Fork Chapter website at www.txmnn.org/elmfork. Registration for this year will close at the end of April.

The City views the payment of the costs of other utilities as an unconstitutional gifting of public funds and unconstitutional lending of its credit.

Late Thursday, Feb. 25, 2021, the district court granted a Temporary Restraining Order in favor of the City of Denton in this matter.

The City of Denton

will explore all legal options to protect the financial assets of the City and its ratepayers from improper use. As this is a pending legal matter, there is currently no additional information or comment.

Director for Plymouth, CT. During this period, she was the lead staff member for the town's housing rehabilitation program and was instrumental in attracting several major employers to the town. She also successfully led the municipality's Main Street Streetscape project.

In addition to her extensive municipal-level experience, Dodds served the County of Burlington in NJ as Principal Planner for two years where she coordinated economic development and planning projects for the 12 cities within

the county's jurisdiction.

The county position was preceded by a three-year stint as Regional Planner for the New Jersey Office of Smart Growth. In this position, she was among the principal links between local and county governments and the state's planning department. She served on a number of project teams which guided planning activities for several large cities and counties in the state.

She holds professional certification from the American Institute of Certified Planners and is a member of the Ameri-

can Planning Association. She has held membership in a number of statewide economic development, diversity, and cultural organizations in Connecticut and New Jersey.

Dodds earned a Master's in City and Regional Planning and a Bachelor of Arts degree in Urban Studies/African Studies, both from Rutgers University.

The new director expressed excitement about joining the staff. "Prosper is a beautiful community that has a bright future," she said. "I'm excited about the opportunity to help shape the future of this community in a way that reflects its goals and values."

close, or otherwise alter the operation of facilities or services of the City of Denton;

- The City Manager is authorized to expend no more \$3,500,000, including previously authorized funds, from the general fund reserve balance during this period to fund essential response activities and functions not already budgeted.

- Authority for the City Manager to accept on behalf of the City services, gifts, grants, equipment, supplies, and/or materials whether from private, nonprofit, or government sources; and
- Continued authorization for an additional \$125,000 for utility assistance.

All businesses and establishments in Denton must abide

by Governor Abbott's Executive Order GA-34 as it may be amended, preempted, or superseded. The Twelfth Order of Council places no additional obligations or restrictions Denton businesses or establishments beyond what is provided in GA-34.

Residents needing utility assistance are asked to call City of Denton Customer Service at 940-349-8700 in order to be referred to a utility assistance provider.

Our Town's Current Events

Visioning our Town's future

One of Cross Roads important projects is the Community Visioning project. You should have already received information about the workshops that we have scheduled to provide a forum for the community to share their vision for the Town of Cross Roads by giving the residents the opportunity to honestly express their goals, objectives, and values. Debbie Womack, CEO of Greater Yield, a skilled facilitator who has worked with numerous Texas towns and cities has offered to provide her services pro-bono to assist our Town with this process.

The Community Visioning Events are to engage residents, community stakeholders, small business owners and other groups that provide services to the Town of Cross Roads with a platform to discuss what they would like their community to look and feel like within the next five to ten years. Ms. Womack positioned the visioning in this way: "The relevant question is not simply what shall we do tomorrow, but rather what shall we do today to get ready for tomorrow? And what does the very best Cross Roads look like?" These are a few of the questions and concepts that these series of events and meetings, which will run from March through May, will help our community to answer. Two in-person meetings were held on Thursday, March 25th at the

Stephen E. Copeland and a virtual Zoom event was held Tuesday, March 30th at 7 pm with for all members of the community. "We are seeking to include as many community members as possible. The more input we have the more meaningful the Visioning process will be for the entire community," noted Debbie K. Womack. "So, if your HOA, Church group, or special organization would like to participate, please contact Kristi Gilbert at the Town of Cross Roads Town Hall or me at dwomack@greateryield.com to schedule a separate visioning session. I will work with you to try and hold as many discussions as possible, to garner as much input from the entire community that we can."

Town Council actions

The Town Council conducted their regular meeting on Monday, March 15th. Discussions and actions included:

- Approval of a variance to the landscape setback from 25' reduced to 18' for a Bank of America planned at the NE corner of FM 424 and US 380. The variance was granted as a result of TxDOT condemning portions of land for the upcoming US 380 construction project.
- Adoption of an Official Zoning Map that incorporates all previous zoning changes (no new changes were included on this map.)
- Adoption of only the updated Future Land Use Plan map and determined

amendments to the text of the plan would happen at a later date when 2020 Census data and Community Visioning Project input was available. The updated map can be viewed on the Town's website. * Approval of a final plat for Aubrey Storage Facility located in the Cross Roads ETJ.

• Discussion of amendments to the Comprehensive Zoning Regulations to remove the Architectural Review Committee and references to the committee as a result of previous legislative changes. Action will be taken on this item after a public hearing on April 5th with the Planning and Zoning Commission and April 19th with the Town Council.

General information

The May 1, 2021 General Election was canceled as a result of unopposed candidates. Ron King will be sworn in to replace Duke Roberson in May. Dave Meek and Wendy White-Stevens were re-elected.

Remember, agendas are posted one week before all Town meetings with all supporting documents. While events may occasionally require an updated agenda, you will know as soon as the Mayor does. Also, all Town meetings are now recorded - Every committee and every board meet are available on the Town website: www.crossroadstx.gov

Wendy White-Stevens ran unopposed in 2021 and was elected in the non-election. The Town of Cross Roads saved thousands of dollars since all three candidates ran unopposed.

Why would a woman who has a business and a family run for the Cross Roads Town Council for the third time? "I ran for public office initially because I believed I could make a positive impact in my community from not only a day-to-day perspective, but also long-term as well," said White Stevens.

Before running for town council Wendy Town served on a number of town committees: the Park Board Chair 2014-2017, MDD 2016-2017, Comprehensive Planning 2012, Park Board Council Liaison 2020 - current.

While teaching in the district, Mrs. Cheek volunteered as a tutor for special education classes at Strickland Middle School and mentored at-risk students at Calhoun Middle School. She served on the Newton Rayzor PTA where her children attended elementary school. Upon her retirement in 2002, Mrs. Cheek became active in a new Denton ISD mentoring program called Grandparents in Public Schools (GIPS). Recruited by then-director of communications, Sharon Cox, Mrs. Cheek played a vital role in helping to implement a program that paired grandparent volunteers with elementary-aged students at Denton ISD schools. The program exploded and has nearly doubled in grandparent volunteers since its inception more than twenty years ago thanks in large part to the role Mrs. Cheek played in helping get the program started. “Pat Cheek dedicated her life to building strong relationships and bringing people together,” said Jamie Wilson, superintendent of schools. “Her love for children, especially those who may not have had a voice or been under-represented, set a tone and an example we wish for our students to emulate. Mrs. Cheek has also been very active in the community over the years. She began teaching Sunday School at Trinity United Presbyterian church in 1959. It was through Mrs. Cheek’s association with the church that she and other women in the community formed the Denton Christian Interracial Fellowship, a group of black and white women, who sought to ease the integration of black students into Denton public schools during the 1960s. Mrs. Cheek, a graduate of Milby High School, arrived in Denton in 1957 to attend school at Texas Woman’s University studying English, Spanish and history. She soon met and married Bill Cheek and the two raised a family of Dentonites. Cheek Middle School, serving sixth through eighth grades, will be located off FM 1385 between Noles and Fishtrap Roads in Prosper supporting the Braswell High attendance zone. It will be the third middle school in the zone. Construction on the school is set to begin this spring with an opening date of fall, 2022.

C.H. Collins Athletic Complex to Host Denton ISD Class of 2021 Commencement Ceremonies

DENTON ISD, TX- C.H. Collins Athletic Complex in Denton will serve as the host venue for several Denton County school district 2020-21 graduations, including all five Denton ISD high schools. The stadium seating capacity of 12,000 provides county school districts a venue with ample space, to meet state and local social distancing requirements during the COVID-19 pandemic. Ceremony dates will see slight alterations to accommodate all participating districts, but graduations will be held as close to their originally scheduled dates as feasible. The schedule for Denton ISD graduation ceremonies are as follows: Ryan High School: 7 p.m. on Wednesday, May 26 Fred Moore High School: 10 a.m. on Thursday, May 27 Braswell High School: 7 p.m. on Thursday, May 27 Guyer High School: 9 a.m. on Friday, May 28 Denton High School: 7 p.m. on Friday, May 28 School and district leaders in the participating districts all agree C.H. Collins Complex offers the closest semblance to the traditional commencement ceremonies. “Hosting this ceremony will mean so much to our students who have not experienced normal milestone events during their final years of high school,” said Dr. Jamie Wilson, superintendent of schools. “Having our high school seniors celebrate a traditional graduation ceremony with their closest family and friends right in our own backyard will be a memory that lasts a lifetime.” This year’s ceremony will largely mirror traditional proceedings, though face coverings and socially distanced seating remain a requirement. C.H. Collins Athletic Complex provides an ample amount of space for graduates’ families and friends. Groups should distance six feet from other groups in the stands and wear face coverings throughout the event. Graduating students and their families will receive additional logistical information about the ceremony, such as arrival times and parking, through school communication in the coming weeks. C.H. Collins Athletics Complex will also host Aubrey ISD and Ponder ISD graduation ceremonies. More information about all senior activities will be communicated directly to families once details are finalized.
