Many people choose to visit France or Italy over this tiny yet attractive country. My recommendation is to go there before the tourists start flocking there.

While sometimes overlooked, Lithuania is known for its ancient history, old and unique language, colorful architecture, cobble streets, rich past, and vast forests, among other beautiful characteristics. When you combine exquisite architecture, natural beauty, and UNESCO World Heritage Sites, it's difficult to understand why this stunning country is not on more people's radar.

The capital of Lithuania, Vilnius, has a lively nightlife, a thriving art scene, and a beautiful sprawling old town. A day can be spent strolling around the winding maze of medieval cobblestone streets in Old Town, which are lined with charming, vibrant buildings. You can pop into cafes, restaurants, bars, galleries, and specialty shops until your heart is content.

Old Town also offers a concoction of Gothic, Medieval, Renaissance, and Baroque architecture. Some highlights also include the Neoclassical Vilnius Cathedral and the Gothic-style St. Anne's Church. There are also large squares with benches and an abundance of green space to unwind. Vilnius, which has one of the largest UNESCO-listed old towns in Northern Europe.

Once you are in Old Town Vilnius, it is easy to walk everywhere. While there are bicycles available to rent and Bolt cars that are affordable and widely available, walking is the most enjoyable way to see the area. Accommodations are plentiful and priced from modest to luxury. We really enjoyed the St. Palace Hotel, which had an affordable and amazing panoramic penthouse room with beautiful views overlooking the city. The other accommodation we absolutely love is the spectacular Hotel Pacai, a member of Design Hotels by Marriott. This hotel is steeped in history and oozes luxury. Treat yourself!

Kaunas, the second-largest city in Lithuania, is worth a visit too. It is the cultural capital. The city has a youthful, vibrant air due to its large student population. It also offers a medical destination for orthopedic surgeries, bariatric surgery, plastic surgery, and dentistry. Their services there raise the bar and should be considered if you are in the market for medical care.

While in Kaunas, take a stroll down Freedom Avenue, billed as the longest pedestrian street in Europe. It is also the main commercial district and a great

place to people-watch. This lively area offers several hotels in various price ranges, including the Kaunas Hotel, the Moxy by Marriott, and the Radisson. Any of these locations are tight in the thick of things, allowing you to walk right out the door onto the avenue. The entire avenue is filled with culinary delights, theaters, shopping centers, and boutiques galore.

Some of the outstanding examples of Art Deco architecture in Europe may be seen in Kaunas, which is also well known for its interwar architecture, which has been recognized as a European Heritage site. There is also a sprawling old town, vibrant street art, impressive museums, and an enchanting castle next to the Nemunas River.

What's to eat? While most foods are available, like in any major city, in Lithuania, you will find traditional rural eating has a strong influence on their cuisine. Common mainstays include smoked sausages, herring, beetroot soup, and mushroom dishes, along with other foraged items. Potatoes and pickled dishes are also extremely popular. Try the national meal, cepelinai or didžkukuliai, which are potato dumplings stuffed with ground meat, dry curd cheese, or mushrooms, sometimes topped with sour cream and bacon sauce. Potato pancakes and fried cheese curd are other popular dishes.

What's that smell? An unusual thing that Lithuania is famous for is being the only country on earth with an official scent, which is fabulous. The Scent of Lithuania was created as a positive

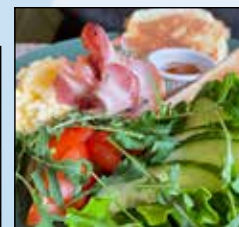
national brand. The lovely fragrance is made up of wildflowers, raspberry, ginger, sandalwood, and musk aromas. Yes, I brought a bottle of it home with me, and it is delightful!

For nature lovers, Lithuanians are famous for their fondness of the outdoors. After all, forests cover over 40% of Lithuania. There are five incredibly well-protected national parks in Lithuania. Each park provides homes for a range of wildlife, including roe deer, wild boar, and hedgehogs. If you enjoy hiking, water activities, or just soaking up the fresh air, you will not be disappointed.

What should you bring back? Lithuania is one of the most amber-rich nations in the world, and you can easily find it in local shops. The country is known for having some of the best-quality amber in existence. It is rendered into small trinkets, luxurious jewelry, and functional items. Amber is a source of national pride and is known for its beauty and therapeutic properties. You can find the ideal amber present for any person on your list.

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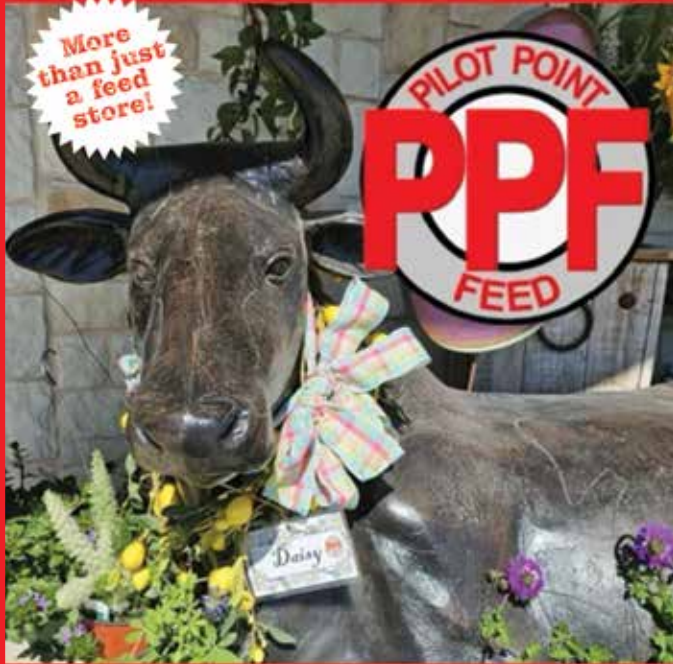
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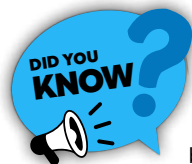
