

COLLIN COUNTY, TX- On Saturday, March 19, investigators with the Collin County Sheriff's Office Child Exploitation Unit (CEU) arrested 27-year-old

Richard Jenkins, II, of Bricelyn, Minnesota, and charged him with Online Solicitation of a Minor-Sexual Conduct.

In an online chat with an undercover CEU investigator, who was posing as a 15-year-old girl in McKinney, Jenkins made clear his intentions to meet and engage in sexual activity.

He drove over 900 miles to pick her up and take her back to Minnesota. He instructed her to tell her

parents that she would be staying for a week at a camp in his home state.

Collin County deputies arrested Jenkins in a local park on Saturday and processed him into the Collin County Detention Facility. Jenkins is currently free after posting a \$250,000 bond.

The Collin County Sheriff's Office would like to thank the Texas Department of Public Safety

COLLIN COUNTY, TX- On Thursday, March 3, 2022, CEU Investigators arrested 41-year-old Alan Wilson, a resident of Denton, and charged him with Online Solicitation of a Minor and Soliciting Prostitution of a Person less than 18 years of

age. Wilson responded to an ad posted by a 14-year-old female seeking babysitting jobs to pay for summer camp. The ad was placed by CEU Investigators.

Wilson began texting an undercover CEU Investigator who was posing as the 14-year-old female at 8:30 am on March 3, and soon after their initial exchange, Wilson made clear his intention to meet for the purpose of having sex.

Wilson requested to pay the 14-year-old \$600 for sex and asked the 14-year-old to use Lyft to meet him at a local





Celebrating Cultures through Food

DENTON COUNTY, TX Every year during the month of March the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics celebrates National Nutrition Month. This year's theme is "Celebrate a World of Flavors," and focuses on celebrating foods and flavors from different cultures all around the world.

Think about a family recipe that has been passed down from generation to generation. Positive memories are often associated with our family meals or ingredients. At its most practical form, food provides our body with nutrients to go and stay healthy; however, food can be an expression of our cultural identity. Our favorite dishes, ingredients, spices, or cooking methods can represent traditions, beliefs, and practices from a variety of different regions, ethnicities, and religions.

Traditionally, cultural foods have been considered unhealthy; however, we know there are a variety of foods available to us that are tasty and nutritious for our bodies. The 2020-2025 Dietary Guidelines for Americans provide a framework that gives each of us the space to adapt our diet as needed based on personal preferences, medical history, budget, and culture. Rather than omitting cultural foods that you love, think about how to make them healthier with these suggestions.

- Be mindful of portion sizes and eat a variety of whole grains, fruits and vegetables, protein, and dairy.
- Eat more unsaturated fats like olive or canola oil, avocados, nuts, and seeds.
- Use a variety of cooking

methods like steaming, baking, roasting, and barbecuing. These cooking methods use less fat compared to frying.

- Reduce salt and sugar intake by using different spices and herbs. Examples include chili powder, curry powder, nutmeg, lemongrass, and cilantro which can be found at many grocery stores.

From Japanese cuisine to a West-African dish or Tex-Mex Tacos and Soul Food, remember there is room at the table for all types of food! This month celebrate a World of Flavors and try a new food that may be less familiar to you!



TWU Regent, Husband Expand Scholarship Program

With \$100K Gift to Denton High Grads, Article Provided By Denton ISD



DENTON COUNTY, TX- Five Denton High School graduates will continue to reap the benefits of a commitment, by a distinguished Texas Woman's University regent and her husband, to help students

succeed academically. Texas Woman's University System Regent Vice Chair Stacie Dieb McDavid and her husband, David McDavid, pledged a \$100,000 gift to the university to expand a scholarship program that covers four years of tuition and fees for five Denton High School graduates.

The gift supports the Dieb-McDavid Scholarship Program at TWU, which the couple established last year. In its inaugural year, the scholarship program awarded scholarships to five Class of 2021 Denton

High School graduates.

The second gift will support scholarships for five Denton High School Class of 2022 graduates who demonstrate a commitment to women's leadership and plan to enroll at Texas Woman's in fall 2022. Regent McDavid is a Denton High alum as well as a graduate of Texas Woman's University.

"David and I are thrilled to give more deserving Denton High School graduates a chance to succeed academically and follow their dreams, and we hope

this inspires others to pay it forward, too," McDavid said.

The announcement was made during a TWU alumni celebration at the National Cowgirl Hall of Fame Museum in Fort Worth on Monday, March 21.

Students must apply and qualify for federal financial aid through the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Based on average financial aid awards to TWU students, the scholarships have an estimated value of \$20,000 each over four years, making the

McDavids' total gift amount approximately \$100,000.

In addition to financial support for the five Dieb-McDavid scholars, those students will have access to a scholarship manager who will serve as a mentor and will assist with academic support services, provide access to study skills training, and monitor academic progress through graduation.

To be eligible for the scholarships, recipients must achieve a 3.0 GPA or higher, graduate in

the top half of their class, and demonstrate financial need based on FAFSA criteria. Eligible Denton High School graduates will be automatically considered for the scholarship during the TWU admissions process.

Recipients will receive scholarship support for up to four years if they remain enrolled full time and maintain consecutive enrollment for up to eight semesters, complete at least two-thirds of their enrolled classes each semester, maintain a GPA of 3.0 or higher, and attend scholarship program activities.

Day, a popular misconception. Instead, it commemorates a single battle. In 1861, Benito Juarez a lawyer and member of the Indigenous Zapotec tribe was elected

president of Mexico. At the time, the country was in financial ruin after years of internal strife, and the new president was forced to default on debt payment to Euro-

pean governments. In response, France, Britain and Spain sent naval forces to Veracruz, Mexico, demanding repayment. Britain and Spain

negotiated with Mexico and withdrew their forces. France, however, ruled by Napoleon III, decided to use the opportunity to carve an empire out of Mexican territory. Late in 1861, a well armed French fleet stormed Veracruz, Landing a large a force of troops and driving president Juarez and his government into retreat. The Battle of Puebla.

Why do we celebrate Cinco de Mayo in the United States? In the United States, Cinco de Mayo

is widely interpreted as a celebration of the Mexican Culture and heritage, particularly in areas with substantial Mexican-American populations. Chicano activists raised awareness of the holiday in the 1960s.

Today, reuel era mark the occasion with parades, parties, mariachi music, Mexican folk dancing and traditional foods.
