Aubrey ISD Holds Groundbreaking Ceremonies at Brockett and Monaco

Aubrey ISD welcomed board of trustees, city officials, staff, students and community members to Brockett and Monaco Elementary Schools to celebrate groundbreakings for renovations and additions at both schools on Sunday, Sept. 16.

With an Aubrey ISD Bond sign and dirt-moving equipment in the background, Aubrey ISD Superintendent Dr. David Belding led the festivities, starting with Brockett and then Monaco.

The central theme of the afternoon was appreciation

for the Aubrey ISD community that voted for the \$51 million bond package last November. One of the first groups that Dr. Belding thanked was the facility planning committee that spent time to address growth, school renovations, additions, and improvements to the Aubrey ISD facilities. Dr. Belding also recognized the school board that called for the bond election and city officials for supporting the project.

In his brief remarks, Dr. Belding mentioned that construction at Brockett will include an addition of 5,942 square feet and a renovation of 3,970 square feet for a total of 9,912 square feet. At Monaco, the addition will add an additional of 4,454 square feet and a renovation of 2,845 square feet total

Denton County Reports Significant Increase in Mosquito Population

DENTON COUNTY

DCPH has previously reported five traps with mosquitoes carrying West Nile Virus (WNV) this year, as well as one positive human case of West Nile Neuroinvasive Disease. DCPH conducts ground spraying for mosquitoes when a mosquito tests positive for WNV or Zika and are within unincorporated areas of Denton County. Within the 45 cities and towns inside Denton County, each maintains unique policies on actions in response to mosquito monitoring, collecting, and ground spraying.

"In countywide sampling, we are seeing up to ten times the number of mosquitoes collected this week compared to previous weeks," states Dr. Matt Richardson, Director of Public Health. "Advising the public of this increase in the mosquito population is a precautionary and proactive measure, and we hope it further encourages residents to utilize protection while outside."

Prosper's Tax Rate Remains Unchanged

and parks and recreation. The budget is scheduled for final assessment and approval at the Sept. 11 Town Council meeting. A copy of the budget is available for review at www.prosptx.gov.

"We've been in a position to maintain the property tax rate at the same level for the last 11 years for several reasons," said Harlan Jefferson, Town Manager. "The steady rise in the value of property in the North Texas area, the Town's prudent financial discipline, and the strategic planning on the part of the Town Council have all contributed to our position."

Keeping the tax rate at \$0.52 per \$100 valuation

for 11 years might be characterized as rare and unusual under the best of circumstances, but it is especially impressive in light of the exponential growth in Prosper's population and the accompanying responsibility to meet the increased municipal needs and services.

"The financial consequences of the consistently upward trend in property values is not lost on Council," added Jefferson. "They understand that residents are looking for tax relief."

In response, the Town has become one of the few communities in Collin

sion of the Senior Management Institute for Police by the Police Executive Research Forum, APD's Leadership Command College, and the West Point Leadership Course. Prior to being appointed Assistant Chief, Dixon was a lieutenant in the Internal Affairs Division, and has previously served as a lieutenant in the Organized Crime Division and the Region 3 Patrol Services Division. He has also served in other various roles, including uniformed patrol, Street Response, Narcotics, Gang Unit/Major Crimes Task Force, Homicide Detective, Patrol K-9, SWAT Sergeant, and Counter-Assault Strike Team.

The City of Denton started the selection pro-

cess in June by working with executive recruitment firm Ralph Andersen & Associates to launch a nationwide search for candidates. After a thorough review and screening of 111 applicants, six finalists were interviewed by executive staff, two community organization panels with 20 groups represented, a panel of current DPD employees, and held a meet and greet with City Council Members. In addition, the candidates were introduced to the Denton community through a public open house, which provided citizens the opportunity to provide feedback on all candidates. To make the final selection, a City team conducted site visits with two finalists, with Chief Dixon being selected as the top candidate.

2018 Taxes – Are You Ready?

County offering a 10 percent homestead exemption for all residents who meet the criteria.

While keeping close tabs on spending, the budget allows for the Town to maintain the same service level that residents deserve and have come to expect, even in the face of the unprecedented growth. Businesses Need Life Insurance Too:



As a small-business owner, you're responsible for two families: the one you have at home, and the one you have through work. No matter what your business, a well-conceived insurance and benefits program is essential. If you die or become disabled, insurance can help protect your family and your business.

To get a sense of how well you've planned for these responsibilities, ask yourself these questions:

- What will happen to my business and family if I die or become disabled?
- What will happen if certain key employees die or become permanently disabled?
- How can I attract and retain the best employees?
- How can I help ensure that my business will be able to weather unforeseen financial hardships?
- What will happen to my business when I retire?

One of the first things any business owner needs to consider is how to protect against events that may threaten the future of the business, like the death or disability of a proprietor, partner or key employee.

Let's start with the worst-case scenario: the death of one of the business owners. What will happen to your business if you die? Many small-business owners take out loans to help grow their businesses, and often secure these loans with personal assets.

If you have business loans and were to die before they were paid off, you might think your family could sell or liquidate the business to cover the debts and provide financial security for them.

In reality, this rarely happens. When the family is forced to sell the business quickly, they may have to sell at a discount or during market conditions that make the business less attractive. In other cases, the business may be worth very little without the proprietor or partner. Individual life insurance can protect your family by providing funds to cover debts, ongoing living expenses and future plans, in the event that something happens to you.

Business insurance can also be structured to fund a buy-sell agreement. This is a contract among owners to buy a deceased owner's share of the business at a previously agreed upon price in the event of death, disability or retirement.

Why are these agreements so important? You might think that if you die, your family could maintain their income by running the business themselves or by hiring someone to handle the day-to-day management. The fact is, your loved ones may not have the skills or the desire for the job, and your co-owners may not welcome the idea of an unintended partner. With a properly structured and funded buy-sell agreement, your business partners won't have to scramble to come up with the money to buy out your share of the business, and you'll

be guaranteed that your survivors will be compensated fairly and promptly.

Buy-sell agreements are typically funded by life insurance policies purchased on the lives of each of the business owners. The amount is usually specified in a contract created with the help of an attorney. You can enter into a buy-sell agreement at any time, but it often makes sense to do so when a business is formed or when new owners are brought into the business. Because business values can fluctuate, it's important to review the contract with your accountant at least once per year or to include a calculation method in the agreement. Also be sure the insurance coverage funding the agreement is up to date.

Business owners can also insure against the risk of becoming disabled and unable to work. In this case, disability income buyout insurance would fund the buy-sell agreement, allowing the disabled owners to be bought out, typically after a one-year waiting period.

Key person insurance is another essential component of a smart business continuation plan. Key person insurance is life or disability insurance purchased by the business on such an employee and payable to the business. When a key person dies or becomes disabled, insurance can help make up for lost sales or earnings or cover the cost of finding or training a replacement.


