Sandbrock Ranch Elementary Students Select Mascot, Colors

A precocious group of fourth-grade students from three campuses in the Braswell High zone took to the ballot box recently, casting their vote on a mascot for Sandbrock Ranch Elementary, Denton ISD's newest and 25th elementary school.

The students chose between the finalists of Stallions, the Champions and the Ponies. In a landslide tally, 72 percent of the students voted Champions as the school's new mascot. School colors will be emerald green, silver and white.

"Things are moving very quickly as we approach the start of the next school year. Selecting the mascot for Sandbrock Ranch Elementary is another exciting step in that journey," said Claire Springer, principal. "Our mission is already taking shape based on the mascot selection. We want everyone to know we will build Champions to be courageous, compassionate and committed learners."

The learning environment inside the halls at Sandbrock Ranch Elementary will consist of six stables, each representing champion horses including Appaloosas, Clydesdales, Galineers, Mustangs, Ponies and Shires.

From those smaller micro-communities, the goal is to build leadership qualities and student voice by using collaborative spaces to interact with students across grade levels. Every student and every staff member should take pride in their stable.

The district's 25th elementary campus is named for the development in which it resides, Sandbrock Ranch, an 800-acre master-planned community in Aubrey directly off FM 1385, near the district's border with the town of Prosper. The development is a former horse farm.

The school, built to serve 750 students, will relieve rapid growth and is the seventh elementary school serving students in the Braswell High zone. Sandbrock Ranch Elementary will open its doors for the first day of school on Thursday, Aug. 11, 2022.

"The mascot being named Champions raises the bar for every single student at Sandbrock Ranch Elementary to reach their full potential," said Dr. Jeff Russell, area superintendent of academic programs in the Braswell zone. "Pairing the mascot name with the unique stable system being implemented by the leadership is a brilliant way to foster a sense of belonging for the students and the entire Sandbrock Ranch community."

More than 1,000 homes have sold in Sandbrock Ranch since home sales began in 2018. Builders in the community are Coventry Homes, David Weekley Homes and Highland Homes. Pricing is from the \$400,000s.

Every year during the month of March the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics celebrates National Nutrition Month. This year's theme is "Celebrate a World of Flavors," and focuses on celebrating foods and flavors from different cultures all around the world.

Think about a family recipe that has been passed down from generation to generation. Positive memories are often associated with our family meals or ingredients. At its most practical form, food provides our body with nutrients to go and stay healthy; however, food can be an expression of our cultural identity. Our favorite dishes, ingredients, spices, or cooking methods can represent traditions, beliefs, and practices from a variety of different regions, ethnicities, and religions.

Traditionally, cultural foods have been considered unhealthy; however, we know there are a variety of foods available to us that are tasty and nutritious for our bodies. The 2020-2025 Dietary Guidelines for Americans provide a framework that gives each of us the space to adapt our diet as needed based on personal preferences, medical history, budget, and culture. Rather than omitting cultural foods that you love, think about how to make them healthier with these suggestions.

- Be mindful of portion sizes and eat a variety of whole grains, fruits and vegetables, protein, and dairy.
- Eat more unsaturated fats like olive or canola oil, avocados, nuts, and seeds.
- Use a variety of cooking methods like steaming, baking, roasting, and barbequing. These cooking methods use less fat compared to frying.
- Reduce salt and sugar intake by using different spices and herbs. Examples include chili powder, curry powder, nutmeg, lemongrass, and cilantro which can be found at many grocery stores.

From Japanese cuisine to a West-African dish or Tex-Mex Tacos and Soul Food, remember there is room at the table for all types of food! This month celebrate a World of Flavors and try a new food that may be less familiar to you!

Three Top High School Musicians in Texas from Aubrey ISD

Aaron Cajilema, Josue Lopez and Xander Rouk were named three of the top high school musicians in the state of Texas last month by the Association of Texas Small School Bands. The three Aubrey High School band members advanced to the all-state band after performing at the ATSSB area audition in January.

Twenty-one Chaparrals were named to the all-region band in November, and the trio were among nine members of the AHS band program that advanced to the area auditions.

Xander, a junior, placed first out of all the percussion players in Aubrey's area; Aaron, a senior, finished first in the tuba area auditions, and Josue, a junior, was seventh chair in the clarinets section, one of the largest groups of instruments.

At the area audition, the musicians have to play in front of a panel of judges. The judges cannot see the musicians auditioning, and the students cannot see the judges. The audition was a culmination of many hours and weeks of work with the students practicing a piece of music.

Xander, Aaron and Josue each had their own personal motivations that kept them practicing early in the morning, at home and on the weekends.

"This year was a lot of by yourself type of work," Xander said. "A lot of... in the band hall when everyone is in here... continuing to hash it out."

Xander felt a combination of pressure and confidence from advancing to the all-state band last year.

"I felt a lot of pressure to make it again," Xander said. "I put a lot on myself. I have a lot of pride in it. My confidence came from me knowing that I succeeded in the past."

When he struggled, he said that he would remind himself that he was capable of succeeding because he had done it before.

For the percussion audition, Xander had to perform on three different instruments: snare drum, marimba and timpani with different music for each instrument.

With more of his instruments at school, Xander would often stay after school and use his off period to practice in the band hall. There were often other band students practicing, preparing for class, and they became very familiar with Xander's music.

"In my last class, there were people singing my audition cut because of how much I practiced it in the ball hall," Xander said. "They memorized it."

Aaron could also be found in the band hall, playing the tuba for as many as several hours a day. For Aaron, it was just determination to make that final cut.

"Last year, I missed it by a chair," Aaron said. "It bugged me a lot because I was so close. Any second I had outside of school, I focused on playing as much as I could." Aaron plays the baritone during marching band season, so it was finding spare minutes before school and after school to play the tuba. He decided to not play football for his senior year so he could concentrate more on the tuba. The senior didn't need anyone reminding him to practice.

"It was just me pushing myself more and more every day," Aaron said.

After placing third chair at area auditions last year with the top two moving on, Aaron was named first chair this year.

Aaron is among a group of students in the band hall very early in the morning. Josue is another one of the early risers.

"Josue is someone who is constantly playing," Aaron said. "You get there in the morning, and he is the first person sitting there with his instrument playing. Josue has a lot of quiet determination."

For Josue, advancing to the all-state band has always been the goal. Every year he stepped a little bit closer. He was named all-region as a freshman, advanced to the area auditions as a sophomore and was named all-state this year as a junior. As he prepared for this year's area auditions, he knew he would have to change his habits.

"As a person, I procrastinate a lot," Josue said. "For this, I had to really try and change the way that I was so that I could put in as much work as possible. I did bits and pieces over time instead of doing everything at the very end. I put in a lot of work. I would do an hour or two a day and when I wasn't practicing, I would look over the music and finger along."


"It paid off," Josue said.

After the excitement of being named to the all-state band, the trio has been busy working on new music for the TMEA Clinc/Convention. They will travel to San Antonio to audition for chair placement in a final concert.

And then, there are more goals. Xander has a goal to advance to the all-state band for a third year.

Josue is taking education in training classes with a goal of becoming a band director.

Aaron is planning on attending BYU in the fall and would love to play tuba for the school or a nearby orchestra.

Be Present and Establish a Routine.




Keep a Positive Outlook.

Dr. Mustafa's Five Oral Hygiene Tips for Busy Moms!



That grungy, filmy feeling in your mouth is the remaining plaque and sticky bacterial waste in between your teeth. So, if you're not flossing, 40% of tooth surfaces weren't addressed leading to gum disease and cavities.
- 4) Utilize a tongue scraper. Your tongue should be pink and not coated with white build up that contributes to bad breath. The white/yellow build up you often see is actually trapped bacteria, food, and debris in the tongue's papillae (those tiny bumps).



he colors of Barcelona are vivid, the vibe is energetic. It is a sophisticated city hugging the coast of the Mediterranean with a thriving economy, and an excellent quality of life. The creativity and the culture are vibrant and exciting. The weather is suitable with days filled with brilliant sunshine. It is a place uniquely its own, the Capital of Catalonia.

Barcelona ticks several boxes for an ideal vacation. It offers beaches for relaxing, mountains and hills for climbing, a rich history with old world charm for exploring, unique architecture for marveling, a seaport for cruising, a happening night life for partying, and excellent food for dining. No matter how long you stay, there is no chance of running out of things to do.

After two years of limited travel, I could not contain myself in one place any longer. The world is vast and I want to see as much of it as I can. Usually, when I travel, I like to stay as long as possible and spur off from my main destination with day trips to surrounding areas. With today's restrictions and travel limitations, I decided to take a different type of trip and stay only in one location for a shorter time.

Barcelona has been on my bucket list for quite some time. Spain was open for tourism, so it became my destination of choice. A few years ago, I spent several weeks in Spain, yet denied myself Barcelona. In a way I am glad I did because this trip allowed me to just focus on one place.

There is such a diverse culture in Barcelona, it feels vastly different from most of Spain. Catalan's have their own language, which enriches their own flavor of art, architecture,

music, and dance. You can lose yourself for days exploring the twisted and narrow streets of the Gothic Quarter, or shopping Las Ramblas, the longest main street in Europe. My favorite thing was learning more about the Catalan Renaissance. More specifically, getting to know Gaudi's art and architecture.

Often, when marveling over images of Barcelona, Antoni Gaudi's architecture is in the picture. While Barcelona is so much more than Gaudi, you can hardly escape him in the city. He left bits of himself everywhere. One place I would love to visit is inside his brilliant mind. I can only imagine how fascinating it must have been. Since that is impossible, the next best thing is to explore his creations, and that is easy. Undoubtedly, his most famous, must be La Sagrada Familia. After going to the temporary Gaudi exhibition at Museu Nacional d'Art de Catalunya, La Sagrada Familia would be my first Gaudi visit.



I have yet to meet a church that I did not like. They amaze and delight me no matter where they fall on the timeline. I started this trip to Barcelona by visiting the historic Barcelona Cathedral because it was right across the square from my hotel. This Gothic cathedral had its groundbreaking in 1298 and its central tower was completed in 1913. Beautiful, imposing, grand, yet familiar. This was a huge contrast to my visit to La Sagrada Familia. It was like nothing I had ever seen before. The basilica was started on March 19, 1882, and the scheduled completion year is 2026, representative for the century of Gaudi's death.

Every element on the exterior and interior of La Sagrada Familia has symbolic significance. While it felt like I was entering a place of worship it was so overwhelmingly strange and eccentric that I had to catch my breath. Every element is inspired by nature, and every measurement has a mathematical reason that resonates throughout the monument. The soaring ceilings are held up by pillars resembling a canopy of trees in various heights, materials, and circumferences to hold the weight of the structure above. You feel like you are walking through a forest. Colors flood the basilica. I visited in the afternoon, so oranges and yellows were the dominant colors bathing the walls and the floors. The way the patterns formed and covered everything it landed on, including other visitors, it reminded me of a kaleidoscope I had as a child. Visually stunning, spiritually moving and an architectural genius like no other. If you visit in the morning, I am told you see mostly blues and greens. No matter the time of day, it is a must see for anyone visiting this cosmopolitan city.

Next stop Park Güell. This private park is situated on Carmel Hill offering amazing views of the city. The construction started during an urbanization movement during 1900 and was completed in 1913, however it was not officially open until almost a decade later. In 1984 it was declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO. The park was originally designed for a master planned community, much like the ones lining Highway 380. The park was never completed but it is still arguably one of the most beautiful parks on the planet. Gaudi abandoned constraints and let his imagination go wherever it wanted to take him. The result was a playful playground for both the body and



mind. One of the most beautiful parts of the park is the continuous bench quilted in vividly colorful ceramic shard mosaics. It is surprisingly comfortable and offers an expansive vista of the city. There is a fee to enter the park, but you can stay as long as you like. It is a perfect place for a long walk and soaking up the warm Mediterranean sun.

A trip to Barcelona cannot be complete without a visit to Casa Batlló, located at number 43 on Paseo de Garcia. In 2021, it was named World's Best Landmark. It was a renovation from a previousbuilding built in 1877 it was completed in 1906. Gaudi had the confidence to take on the project and was given full artistic license by the property owner Josep Batlló. Gaudi redesigned everything from the facade to the interior, making it a continuous dialogue of art and function. Gaudi never explained his design, or inspiration for the dwelling. However, the marine-inspired facade is one of the two most popular interpretations. It is easy to get



sucked into a jubilant feeling as the light's glow reflects off the vivid ceramic scale like tiles, breathing life and movement onto the urban street. The Inside curves and bends like fluid nature, with each room holding a new surprise, full of disguised function behind color and whimsy. Casa Batlló is also known as The House of the Dragon, because of its interpreted reference to the Legend of St. George, patron saint of Catalonia. It was he who killed the dragon to save the princess. Many see the scales formed by tiles, the ribs in the columns and the sword through the roof. Most people agree that Gaudi never explained so that each individual can draw their own conclusion based on their individual experience inside.

One place I cannot recommend enough is Palau de la Música Catalana. It was completed in 1908, by architect Lluis Domenech i Montaner. It is considered the jewel of Catalan Art Nouveau. There is not another concert hall of this style listed by UNESCO. If you cannot attend a concert, book a tour. Plan to arrive early and visit Cafe Palau, it is absolutely delicious to look at. Have a coffee or a meal but do take time to feast your eyes on this beautiful cafe. After a leisurely coffee, go on a tour. They offer several in English throughout the day. It will give you a complete history of the venue as well as a taste of the acoustics. Have your camera ready, because after you catch your breath, you will want to snap away at the stunning interior auditorium. The skylight is so magical it is hard to believe it can structurally exist at all. It defies gravity as it captures light, spilling over the lavish concert hall below. The whole experience is like entering an enchanted music box. Don't miss this experience.

There are so many other things to do in this captivating city. Get lost in the Gothic Quarter, dunk into charming coffee shops or tapa houses and while the day away. Visit the aquarium and stroll around the marina. Take a Hop-On-Hop-Off bus tour to get an overview of the city. Go to a soccer game and party at the clubs afterward. The options are endless. That is what makes Barcelona a great fit for any traveler. Any time of year is a good time to visit. Soak up some Catalonian sun, experience the culture and really absorb the colors of Barcelona!



At the time, the country was in financial ruin after years of internal strife, and the new president was forced to default on debt payment to European governments.

In response, France, Britain and Spain sent naval forces to Veracruz, Mexico, demanding repayment. Britain and Spain negotiated with Mexico and withdrew their forces. France,

however, ruled by Napoleon III, decided to use the opportunity to carve an empire out of Mexican territory. Late in 1861, a well armed French fleet stormed Veracruz, Landing a large a force of troops and driving president Juarez and his government into retreat. The Battle of Puebla.

Why do we celebrate Cinco de Mayo in the United States? In the United States, Cinco de Mayo is widely interpreted as a celebration of the Mexican Culture and heritage, particularly in areas with substantial Mexican-American populations. Chicano



activists raised awareness of the holiday in the 1960s.

Today, revel era mark the occasion with parades, parties, mariachi music, Mexican folk dancing and traditional foods.
